5. Faith moves forward when we do not have all the answers. The obstacles will never disappear before a doubting spirit.

6. Faith is trusting God even when nothing seems logical. Illogical faith is not sight and sight is not faith. Faith claims the victory before it ever experiences victory.

From January 2020, Australia Pacific Training Coalition (APTC) has commenced working in partnership with Afutara and Batuna Rural Training Centres in Solomon in upgrading their skills package delivery for Agribusiness and Building and Construction.

As part of this working relationship, APTC has donated two ray boats and two 60 horse powered engine together with drums of fuel and marine safety equipment to support the RTCs deliver and access industry for the agreed programmes. On the 20th of June the Australian High Commissioner to the Solomon Islands, His Excellency Dr. Lachlan Strahan together with APTC Country



Director, Abigail Chang faciliated a handover ceremony to Afutara, Batuna, Tabaka Training Centers and Don Bosco Technical Institute.

The costs of procuring these are for Afutara and Batuna were around \$417,900.00 Solomon dollars. As a Church Education Authority, we sincerely acknowledge and thank the Australian Government and her people; and also, the vision and passion the APTC Country Director has to help build and capacitate our two technical centers.

# SCHOOL PRAYER BREAKFAST

Olwie Adventist Primary School is small and is located just outside of Port Vila town in Vanuatu. It consists of 9 teaching staff with a non-teaching principal. Due to the influences of this school in the community, many parents are sending their children to this school.

This year the school hit high enrolment of 328 students and 56% of these students comes from Non-Adventist home. In June this year the school, for the first time organised and engaged the students on a Prayer Breakfast program instead of having the regular/weekly chapel exercise.

The prayer breakfast theme focus on the school virtue for the week 'self-control' to help students know that God through the holy spirit, He is able to help everyone to develop and have self-control.

According to one of the teacher, "the feedback from staff and students were positive and are requesting for another program." The result from this prayer breakfast and other influences from the school encourages many students requesting to participate in the Bible study class. ### WE MUST BUILD RESILIENT SCHOOLS

Solomon Islands is still bracing itself for the COVID-19 pandemic. The government is taking all necessary steps to control the boarders and continue to activate all quarantine centers to curb the disease. As schools ready to resume classes for term 3, the MEHRD is preparing the school with more information's for the teachers to know and understand to avoid panic. The Honiara City is still under SOE and all schools are expect to comply with all COVID-19 rules. Recently all the Schools leaders in Honiara undergone an intensive training by the UNICEF through MEHRD to make sure school all schools in the city are COVID-19 competent especially with their WASH facilities. After the training, the school leaders must cascade the training to the school level.

After successfully attending the training our school leaders who attend the trainings from Kukum, Burns Creek and Palm Drive schools organize themselves and facilitate a three days from (11-13/07/21) of intensive training going through basically preparation details on WASH issues and in preparation for emergencies.

There should learning continuity for all learners in whatever emergency the school face. In addition to the WASH training, the teachers also had session on the Chaplaincy day out and the QSAF materials.





Feedback from the teachers is quite encouraging and challenging especially with the sessions on self- care, the need for physiological support for teachers and students and preparing emergency educational packs for learners during emergencies.

Our schools must at all-time ready for all hazards and learning must continue.

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### PLAYGROUND A POWERFUL LEARNING TOOL

The new school playground at Beulah Adventist Primary School was opened today, Thursday, 15 July 2021 by the CEO, Ministry of Education & Training, Dr Tangikina Steen and dedicated by the President of the Tonga Mission of the Seventh-day Adventist Church, Pr Fanueli Mataele. Also present at this joyous event was Mr Fatongia Hopoate, Education Director of Adventist Schools, Pr Sione Naulala, Chair of the School Board, Dr Elisapesi Manson, Education Consultant of Tonga Mission of the Seventh-day Adventist Church and Mr 'Onetoto 'Anisi, Deputy CEO, Sports & Recreations Division, Ministry of Internal Affairs. Teachers, students, parents, families and friends were excited witnesses of this significant achievement.

The playground was constructed to closely resemble the interests and imaginations of the students taking into consideration the school context, settings and topography. reason, a short study was For this conducted among the students at Beulah Adventist Primary School to inform the design of the playground. A mixed methodology design was employed where both qualitative and quantitative data was collected and analysed to inform the design of the playground. A total of 20 different forms of play games were installed in the playground using waste materials such as used tyres and other local materials such as sands, bamboos and woods.

The playground project is valued at TOP\$70,000 which was entirely funded from generous donations, voluntary efforts and commitments of various key stakeholders. The playground project engaged collaborations between the school board, Parents & Teachers Association, alumni, local communities and businesses, local football club, families and friends. A total of \$6,000 cash donations was received and inkind donations of approximately \$64.000 was also received that included materials, used tyres, building equipment, labour, consultancy and many others. Thank you to everyone who have supported the playground project and to God be the glory. May this playground become a model of how locally available materials can promote quality learning that is not only achievable but also sustainable.
