REDEMPTIVE DISCIPLINE FOR GROWING LEADERS

Understanding how God deals with sin and a sinner from the experience of King David can help Parents, teachers, church leaders and administrator guide, groom, and correct potential leaders and leaders within and outside the church organization.

I have used David's example in the Bible to draw some points, from my view, to help remind administrators, teachers, chaplains, parents and church leaders. These points may assist us to guide, train and discipline promising young leaders in our institutions today. Let us reflect on how God disciplined and trained young David till his adult hood. God's redemptive discipline and training for David as a promising young leader made him become what he was in his days.

- As a son in his father's home he was given responsibility to care for the flock of sheep. He did his work willingly and faithfully. I Sam 16:11, 17:19
- A young man who took delight in God's word. Ps 119:11, 105.
- Once anointed as king of Israel to replace King Saul, God prepared him by allowing him to serve King Saul in the palace and learned first hand experience. 1 Sam 16:21-23
- God disciplined and trained him to be a commander of Saul's army by allowing him to lead 1000 soldiers(I Sam 18:13-16) to battle, regardless of Saul's evil intention, and later lead his 600 men in the wilderness so he could depend entirely on God for protection and taking risk for his soldiers.
- In addition God took him away from the comfort zone of his family, friends and even the Throne room to humble him before he sits on the throne.
- God taught him to be patient and respect his leader, the anointed one. In God's timing He will give him the throne.(1 Sam 24: 5 -7)
- God gave him responsibility to train and shape him to care for his soldiers and his people just as he had cared for the sheep.
- When he became the King of Israel and fell from the ideal expectation, God confrontedhim through Prophet Nathan. David acknowledge his great mistake, he was remorseful, and was prepared to face the consequences. God withheld his privilege from raising his son born from the unacceptable union. This was something which he desired most. However God blessed David's second son, through Bathsheba, to become his successor after him. (2 Sam 12: 1-25)

Therefore Adventist teacher's are God's agent on earth to accomplish this Mission in the Adventist Education system. Part and puzzle of the process of fulfilling that mission is through the redemptive discipline. This would mean to correct, educate and train students so as to bring them to a saving relationship with Christ. From this relationship Christ can empower, influence, instruct someone to fulfil his/her purpose for living in this world and the world to come.

In 2020 the students have bene motivated by Nehemiah's building Jerusalem and under the leadership of the year 10 students built and completed the new local school dining hall within three weeks.
